Beginning in Bees Training – Saturday, 28 and Sunday, 29 September 2019

The Parramatta Club continues to provide new beekeepers with the opportunity to learn all they can about beekeeping through Beginning in Bees Workshops. Beginning in Bees is a 2-day Workshop, held over a weekend. Details of the next Workshop are as follows:

• Workshop Outline:

- Introduction and Housekeeping
- Rules and Regulations for keeping bees in NSW
- WHS (reactions, aggressive bees, heatstroke, protective gear)
- Honeybee biology (difference between bee castes, numbers in a hive, variety of bee roles, beehives and hardware)
- Starting your first hive, locating/positioning of hives
- Feeding hives
- Lighting and extinguishing a smoker
- Use of a smoker to manage bees
- Using a hive tool
- Problems associated with moving hives
- Responsibilities in keeping a diary
- Management of hives year round
- Equipment (assembly of boxes, bottom boards, lids, frames, Embedding foundation)
- Hive opening and closing theory and practical (weather dependent)
- Honey extraction (process and storage)
- What to do with cappings and beeswax
- Collecting a swarm (how, equipment and after care)

If the weather is not conducive to a practical hive opening exercise taking place, that activity will be organised at a later date.
