# Dates and Activities Far North Coast Beekeepers Club Workshop

When: 11th September 2022

Time: 9.00am to 11.30am.

Please bring your clean veil and protective gear for viewing the apiary, all other bee gear will be provided, your own chair and clean cup and something to share for morning tea. Shade and tea and coffee will be available.

The current Varroa mite DPI bee movement restrictions mean that queen and nucleus breeders will not be able to trade this season and therefore you may need to replace some of your queens with ones you produce yourself. The morning will include an explanation and demonstration of how to achieve this and also:

- Splitting a hive (to make two hives)
- Identifying Queen cells and swarm cells
- Reducing the risk of swarming
- Methods to produce a new queen

The discussions and demonstrations will be led by Merve McDonald, Steve Fowler and Robert Stone

Make sure that the location of your hives is registered with DPI.

If you have not already done so, you are encouraged to perform a sugar shake test on your hives and report any positive results immediately to DPI.

All beekeepers should try to minimise swarming to reduce the risk of Varroa mite spreading. The Amateur Beekeeper newsletter also contains information on preventing swarms and we'll discuss this at our September meeting.

# Recipe – Honey Peanut Energy Balls

1 cup quick oats

½ cup crunchy natural peanut butter

1 tsp vanilla extract

½ cup almond meal

1/3 cup raw honey

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup choc bits or chopped dates



Mix all the ingredients together.

Roll into bite sized balls (use wet hands) – makes about 24 ball

Roll in dessicated coconut

Store in airtight container in the fridge
