Just a note on pricing your honey ... it is not good business to sell your honey too cheaply. Good quality honey in containers, correctly labelled etc is worth \$10 - \$12 per kilo, **minimum**. If you want to be more competitive, think presentation or other marketing strategies rather than devaluing your honey by reducing the price. There have been issues with some imported wax products, so good Australian wax is becoming more valuable. Consider processing your wax if you are not already doing it.

As always, we are seeking venues for our meetings throughout the year. I know it is a big ask, but if you are willing to host a meeting, second Sunday of a month, please let us know.

FRANK'S HIVE HINTS No 12

By this time of the year you should have harvested some honey. Fully capped combs and some 3/4 capped combs can be extracted, but leave some in the hive in case conditions change.

Bloodwood trees (Eucalyptus gummifera) are flowering now with showy bunches of white blossom. Their bark is dark and rough. The honey is a reddish colour with a pleasant flavour. It has a stringy property.

Ironbark trees (Eucalyptus paniculata) can flower well this season on the coast. It produces the best coastal honey. Your bees may have gathered some. It is usually light in colour with good density and an excellent flavour. The flowers are tiny and the bark dark and roughly furrowed. However it is a poor pollen producer. Other flowers may compensate for this.

Check to see if the queen is laying well. If she is doing poorly replace her now so that the hive will be strong before Winter.

We all learn by observation. Mistakes made this season will help us to do better next season.

COVID-19 SAFETY MEASURES FOR OUR MEETINGS (current 23/01/21)

COVID-19 remains a risk, so we must continue to take responsibility in protecting one another when gathering for meetings. The following steps are to be followed as a consequence:
